Chairman's Vision

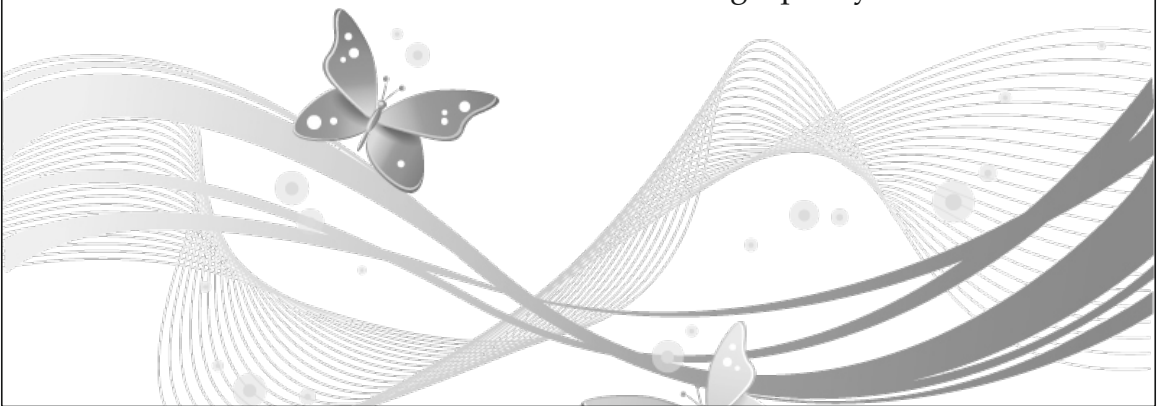

2. The photocopies of all the certificates have to be attested by a gazette officer during the submission for the admission.

ATTENDANCE

1. The pupil has no right to take leave of absence without class teacher's permission.
2. Pupils have to produce a medical certificate for a sick leave.
3. Absence without permission as well as late-attendance will be viewed seriously. On no account it will be tolerated. Late comers will not be entertained inside the school campus.
4. A pupil's absence for more than five consecutive days will result in removing his or her name from the nominal roll.
5. 85% of attendance is compulsory for an academic year. Any breach of this rule may disqualify the pupil from being promoted to the higher class.

TO THE PUPILS

1. All the students should converse in English inside the school.
2. All pupils should attend the school in school uniform with Identity card.
3. Uniform cloth should be neat and clean. Pupils with uncombed hair, coiffure, dirty finger-nails, unpolished shoes etc... will face serious censure.
4. Pupils should be present in the school campus before 15minutes (i.e. before the first bell).
5. Perfect silence should prevail during the prayer and at all school functions.
6. The classrooms and the school premises in general should be kept neat and tidy. Scribbling on the walls, wall graffiti, littering, damaging the school property etc... are strictly forbidden. Anyone causing such damage will have to compensate by replacement or paying fine.
7. Students should not bring valuable things to the school.
8. Neither parents nor students should give money or gifts to the friends and teachers of the school.
9. Students who expect to return home late from school must inform their parents in advance.

10. Students are not allowed to take any photos or videos inside the school campus.
11. The school diary is an important personal record of the pupil; so every pupil should take special care in bringing diary to the school every day.
12. Students should be regular in doing their class work and home work assignments as instructed by the teachers.
13. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against those who continuously misbehave or indulge in nefarious activities.

WITHDRAWAL OF WARDS

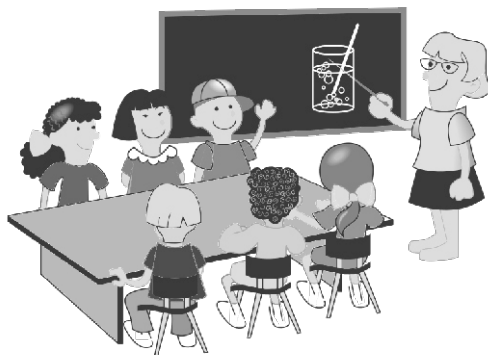
1. Transfer Certificates will be issued only to those pupils who have settled all their dues.

- ❖ The janitors and teachers will help you when you take your lunch.
- ❖ Check whether the teacher has written any instructions in your diary.
- ❖ Remember to show it to your parents, get their signature and reply, if any, and show it to your teacher the next day.

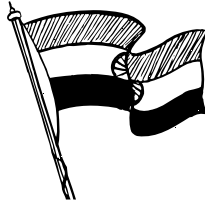
